

How often do you visit your grandparents? Where do they live?



Situation: Joo-Kyung's mother died a year ago, and now her 72-year old father lives alone in an apartment. Joo-Kyung just received a phone call from the owner of the apartment. She's telling her husband some bad news.

Jane: Bad news, John. That was Mr. Moon. You know, the guy who owns my father's apartment.

John: What's up? Is your father OK?

Jane: Yes, yes, he's fine. That's not what he called about. Mr.

Moon wants my father to move out of his apartment at the end of the month.

John: What? In 30days? Why?

Jane: I'm not sure. He was very vague about it. Maybe Mr. Moon is afraid my father will die in the apartment.

John: Oh, and he thinks that would be bad luck... and nobody will want to rent it again?

Jane: Yeah, maybe, something like that.

John: But your father's in good health. Moon can't do that.

Jane: Yes, he can. The lease is over at the end of the month.

John: Oh, yes, that's right. What are we going to do?





Jane: Since I'm the only child, we have to take care of him. He will come to live with us.

John: Here? In this tiny apartment? There are only 2 bedrooms. We can't move our two sons out of their small bedroom.

Jane: What else can we do? I'm his only child. We have to take care of him.

John: Maybe we could look for a new place to live. A bigger place.

Jane: In New York? You know that's impossible.

We looked last year and everything in this area of the city is too expensive. We need to move away from New York. Someplace cheap.

John: But then I would be far away from my office. It might take me up to two hours on the train. I hate to commute.

Jane: OK. The only way is for Father to live with us, here in this apartment.

John: Impossible!
