Kenji is having a problem with his girlfriend, Mika. He wrote to a website where couples can receive free professional advice on their relationships. Listen to his letter and the response.

My name is Kenji. I am 28 years old and have a good job and a wonderful girlfriend, Mika. I have a problem, and I don't know what to do. I hope you can help me.

Mika and I have been dating for over three years. We love each other very much. I want to marry her, but first I need to save money for two or three years. I want Mika to live with me in my apartment. I think it's a good idea to start living together, anyway and think about marriage later.

She lives at home with her parents. I want Mika to stop living in her parents' house and move into my apartment.

Mika told me that she wants to be with me, but she is worried about her parents. She thinks they are old-fashioned in their beliefs. Her dad told her that a man and a woman should not live together before marriage. She thinks her parents will be very angry with her if she lives with me before we get married.

She is 24 years old and has a good job. She's a grown woman, not a young girl. She should explain to her parents about our situation and then move out of her parents' house and live with me. Mika does not need her parents' permission to live with me. What do you think? Am I right?

Present Conditionals

 The Present Real Conditional is used to talk about what you normally do in real-life situations.

```
[If / When ... Simple Present ..., ... Simple Present ...]
```

```
[... Simple Present ... if / when ... Simple Present ...]
```

Examples:

- 1. If the weather is nice, he walks to work.
- 2. Daddy helps me with my homework when he has time

Present Unreal Conditional

•The Present Unreal Conditional is used to talk about what you would generally do in imaginary situations.

[If ... Simple Past ..., ... would + verb ...]


[... would + verb ... if ... Simple Past ...]

Examples:

- I would read more if I didn't watch so much TV.
- 2. Mary would move to Japan if she spoke Japanese.
