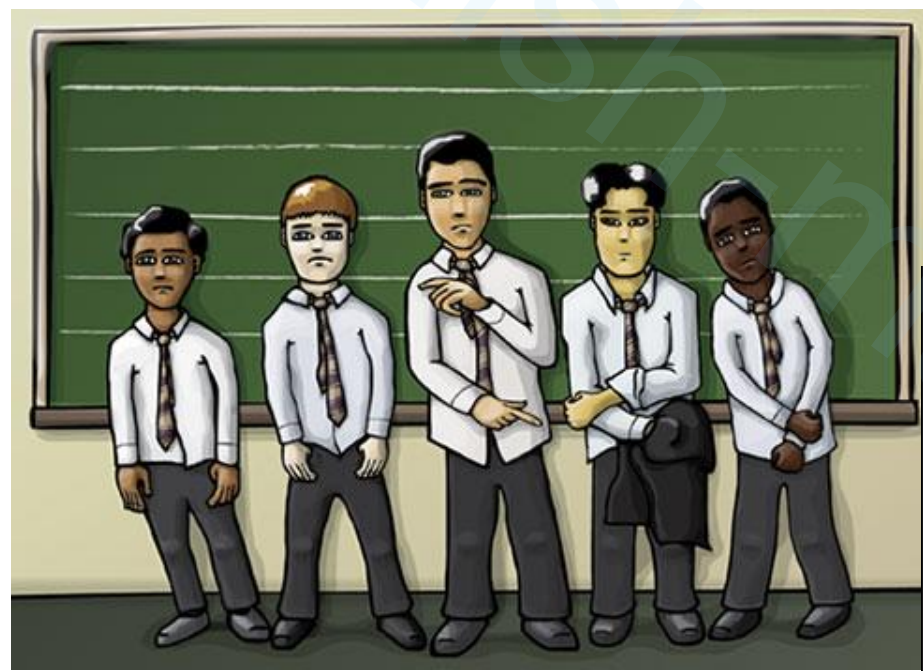

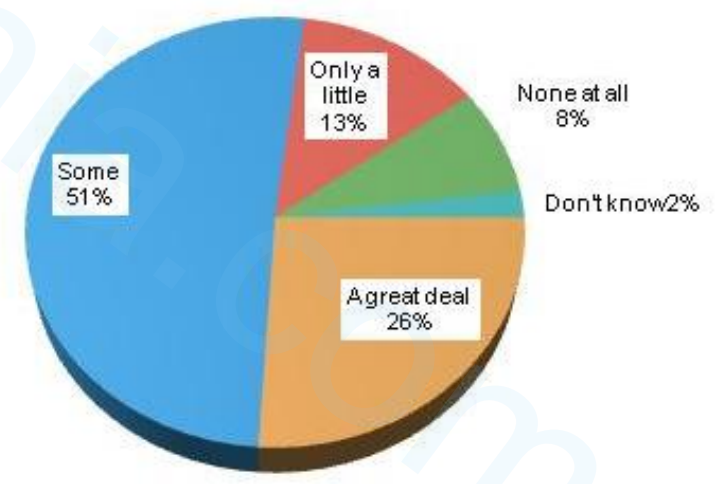

Do you often see racial discrimination in your country? In what way? What other forms of discrimination have you seen happen around you?



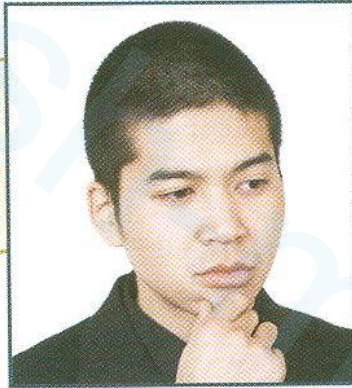
Would you say there is a great deal of discrimination, some discrimination, only a little discrimination, or none at all against...blacks?

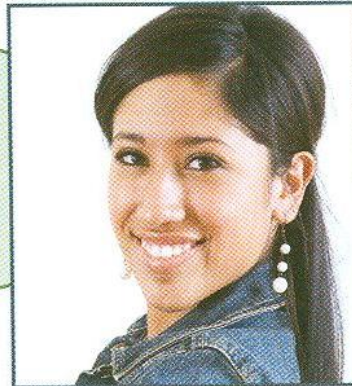
**Shingo:** Mr. Ware is a good person. He wants to save his country.
