P: Not a big one, but there's a kitchen area with a fridge, a microwave and a sink. But I haven't got a cooker.

A: What about furniture?

P: We've got a coffee table. It's valuable because it's very old. And there are two chairs, they're made of wood. And we've got a sofa.

A: No dining table?

P: No, we always eat on the sofa!

A: OK. Now, electrical equipment. Is there a TV?

P: Yes, of course. And we've got a music system.

A: Any computers?

P: Yes, I've got a laptop computer – I use the internet a lot.

A: And have you got a mobile phone?

P: Yes, I have.
