Dialogue 1: Passing inspection with minor problems

A: Please place your bags on the conveyor belt.

B: I have to take off my jewelry, right?

A: Yes, please. Walk through the detector.

B: What's the beep? I took all my accessories off.

A: Try checking your hair or your belt.

B: Oh, I see. It's my hairpin. Here, I took it out.

A: Now try again.



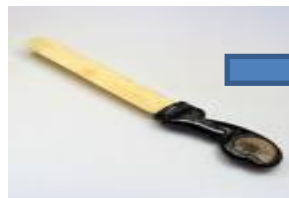
Conveyor belt - A mechanical apparatus consisting of a continuous moving belt that transports materials or packages from one place to another.

Words to remember:

- place - physical environment.
- jewelry - objects of precious metal often set with gems and worn for personal adornment.
- detector - a device for detecting a short usually high-pitched sound (as from a horn or an electronic device) that serves as a signal or warning
- beep - the presence of electromagnetic waves or of radioactivity

Dialogue 2: When an item not allowed on board is found.

A: Don't go yet, sir. What's this?
B: That's my paper knife. It must've been in my pencil case.
A: Sir, you're not allowed to take aboard weapons of any kind.
B: I know, but it's just stationery.
A: I'm sorry. You can't take it with you.
B: Too bad. I'll just throw it away.
A: Give it to me, and I'll do that for you. Have a good trip.



▪ paper knife - a knife for slitting envelopes or uncut pages; the knife of a paper cutter.



▪ pencil case - a box for holding pencils.
▪ weapon - something (as a club, knife, or gun) used to injure, defeat, or destroy.
▪ stationery - materials (as paper, pens, and ink) for writing or typing; letter paper usually accompanied with matching envelopes.

Dialogue 3: When something is confiscated

A: Please put your belongings on the belt and go through the gate.

B: I have a Swiss Army knife. I can't take it, right?

A: No, you can't. you should have put it in your luggage.

B: I forgot. What should I do? It is very important to me.

A: We can probably get it back to you. Ask for it at your destination airport.

B: Please do that. I'm serious.

A: Don't worry. I'll take care of it.



- personnel - a body of persons usually employed (as in a factory, office, or organization)
- confiscate - deprived of property by confiscation.
- belongings – possession.
- Swiss Army Knife
- destination - place to which one is journeying or to which something is sent

Dialogue 4: When metal is found on Your clothing items

A: Put your bags on the belt and your other belongings in this basket.

B: There's some metal on my shoe buckles. Should I take them off?

A: No, we'll remember that. Come through the gate.

B: Anything else?

A: Could you raise your arms for a second?

B: Sure. Watch out for my shoes.

A: Let me take a look. All right, you're good to go.



Shoe buckle

- basket - a receptacle made of interwoven material.
- shoe buckles - An ornament that resembles this clasp, such as a metal square on a shoe or hat.
- raise - to cause or help to rise to a standing position.
