Dialogue 1: Passing inspection smoothly

A: May I see your passport and entry card?

B: Here you are.

A: Where did you board this flight?

B: In Korea, at Incheon Airport.

A: All right. What's the purpose of your visit?

B: I'm here to visit a relative who is ill.

A: Okay. Keep this half of your card for the return flight. You may go.



Dialogue 2: When you are in the wrong line

A: Please show me your passport.

B: Here it is.

A: Oh, you can't enter here. This booth is for U.S. citizens only.

B: Then where should I go?

A: To the visitor's line, to your left.

B: Sorry about the mistake. Thank you.

A: You're welcome. Next in line please?



Dialogue 3: When you haven't filled out the right form

A: Kindly show me your passport and entry card?

B: Here you are.

A: Where did you board this flight?

B: In Korea, at Incheon Airport.

A: This is not the right form.

B: I'm sorry for my mistake.

A: Okay. Please fill out this and be more careful next time.

A: May I see your passport?

B: Here you are.

A: Where did you board this flight?

B: In Los Angeles, at Los Angeles International Airport.

A: Why are you here? What's the purpose of your visit?

B: I'm here to visit my cousin who works here.

Dependent clause- contains a subject and a verb, but no complete thought.

Ex: I wrote myself a novel last year. – Independent
after I wrote my first novel last year- dependent
