Since the creation of the World Wide Web in the early 90s we've come a very long way in a very short time. Businesses have been quick to take advantage of the new medium for a number of reasons. Some because it offers better customer service, some because it's a much faster and more cost-efficient way of conducting business, and some because it allows the business to create a worldwide marketplace. I'd like to look at some of the newer developments and suggest where they're going in the future. First I'll talk about e-banking. Banks were very quick to see the potential of the Internet as a way of allowing customers to do their business without leaving their computers. The advantages are obvious, and the banking industry estimates that 48% of all banking transactions will be done using the Web by 2010. The next example is e-learning. Universities and colleges have seized on the potential for distance learning through the Internet. Thus, they can attract foreign students who do not need to leave their homeland. During the next several years, e-learning will expand to cover everything from corporate training to secondary schooling in remote areas. Related to e-learning is the business of e-books. More and more publishers and libraries are making entire books available for download on the Internet. Manufacturers are coming up with new devices for reading e-books in convenient ways. Some industry analysts predict that in the next ten years, more books will be released in electronic format than in print. Finally, I'd like to mention the new phenomenon of e-secretaries. These are secretaries that work freelance from home. All they need is a computer and an Internet connection. Companies can see the attraction of having people they can call on to do work as needed, rather than having full-time staff members in the office. And the secretaries themselves can enjoy the freedom of working from home during the hours that suit them. Employment agencies are reporting that they're receiving an increasing demand from industry for workers of this kind. However, demand exceeds supply. The e-secretaries are small in number now, but by 2020 this could be the norm.
