Topic Sentences:

I'd better get going.

I think I have to go now.

I'm afraid I must say good-bye.

It's time to leave.

I'm going to take off now.

Dialogue A

A: Ally, **I'd better get going.**

B: *Why are you leaving so early, Danny?*
It's only 4 o'clock.

A: I promised my brother to help him with his math homework today.

B: I see. You're a really good brother.

Dialogue B

A: It's already 10 o'clock. **I'd better get going.**

B: Is it that late already? *I lost track of time.*

A: I really had fun today. Next time, why don't you *come over to my house?*

B: I will. I had a great time, too.

Dialogue A

A: Michael, why don't you stay longer?

The night is still young.

B: I want to, but **I think I have to go now**, Bill.

A: You have something to do?

B: I have a job interview tomorrow morning.

Dialogue B

A: **I think I have to go now.**

I have a meeting *scheduled for* 3 P.M.

B: Okay, you need time to prepare for the meeting.

A: Are you going to leave now, too?

B: No, I want to *stay here* and enjoy the food.

Dialogue A

A: Julie, I'm afraid I must say good-bye.

I have to *rush* to catch the last train.

B: Okay. I had a really good time today.

A: Me too. See you again.

B: *Take care*, Tom.

Dialogue B

A: Young, I'm afraid I must say good-bye.

B: This early? *I was about to* ask you to have dinner with me.

A: I have to *look after* my nephew today.

B: I guess we'll have to do it next time.

Dialogue A

A: Oh, it's past 9 o'clock already.

It's time to leave, Harry.

B: I will drive you home, Sally.

A: You don't have to. I can take a taxi.

B: *It's very dangerous* at this late hour.

I'll take you home.

Dialogue B

A: Look at the time. It's 6 already.

It's time to leave.

B: Be careful, George. The boss doesn't like us to leave the office *at 6 on the dot*.

A: I don't care. *I've done my work for today* anyway.

B: You are so brave.

B: Can you *give me a ride* to the subway station?

A: Sure. Let's go.

B: Thanks a lot. I hope I'm not too much trouble.

Dialogue B

A: I'm going to take off now, Belle.

It was a really wonderful dinner

B: I'm glad that you enjoyed the food, Nick.

A: *You are an excellent cook*, Belle.

You're good at everything.

B: I'm flattered. Thanks.
