When you want to call someone

Topic Sentences:

I'll call you later.

I'll contact you by phone later.

I'll give you a ring later.

I'll give you a call later.

I'll call you in a bit.

Dialogue A

A: It was nice to see you again, Susan.

B: *Same here*, Michael. **I'll call you later.**

A: OK. I'll talk to you soon.

Dialogue B

A: It was a great blind date today, Charles.

B: Yes, I had a *fabulous time*.

A: Let's *get together* again.

B: Sure. **I'll call you later**, Lisa.

Dialogue A

A: Tom, *how's it going* in Paris?

B: Do you know what time it is?

It's *three in the morning*!

A: Oh, sorry. I forgot that you are in the opposite side of the globe. **I'll contact you by phone later.**

Dialogue B

A: Hello. This is Apex Telecommunications.

Is this Mr. Jackson?

B: Yes, what is this about?

A: We are offering free long distance service to our best customers.

B: Really? But, *I am in the middle of something* right now.

A: **I'll contact you by phone later.**

A: *Do you have time to talk?*

B: *Sorry. I have someone on the other line.*

A: Okay. Then, **I'll give you a ring later.**

Dialogue B

A: May I speak to Tom? This is Linda.

B: Hi, Linda. *This is he.*

Why did you call me at work?

A: I have something to discuss with you.

Can we talk now?

B: Sorry. The executives are walking around the company. **I'll give you a ring later.**

Dialogue A

A: Hi, Joanne. Do you have time to *get a bite*?

B: *I'd love to, but* I have to study now.

A: **I'll give you a call later.**

Dialogue B

A: Let's go and play soccer.

B: That sounds great.

Oh! *I left my bag* in the classroom.

I should go get it.

A: Do you want me to go with you?

B: I can go *by myself*.

I'll give you a call later.

Dialogue A

A: Is someone crying?

B: I think my baby sister just woke up.

A: You should go *take care of* her.

I should go home.

B: OK. **I'll call you in a bit.**

Dialogue B

A: It's time to go home.

B: *The night is still young.*

Stay with me a little longer.

A: If I do, I'll be grounded.

Let me go home now, and **I'll call you in a bit.**

B: Oh, well. *What can you do?*
