

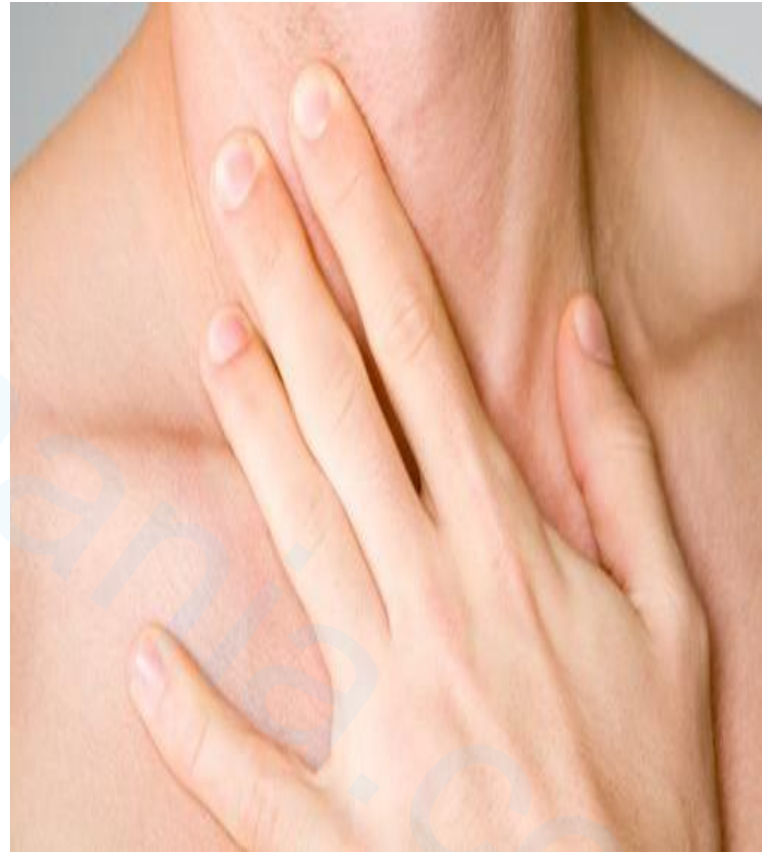

Topic Sentences:

❖ *I have a very sore throat.*

❖ *My throat hurts.*

❖ *I have a pain in my throat.*

❖ *My throat aches.*

❖ *My throat is swollen.*

❖ Dialogue A

A: Hello, Mr. Henny.
What seems to be the problem?
B: **I have a very sore throat.**
A: OK. *Let's take a look.*

❖ Dialogue B

A: What's bothering you?
B: **I have a very sore throat.**
A: *When did it start?*
B: It started last weekend.



Notes:

❖ Dialogue A

A: What's the trouble?

B: **My throat hurts.**

A: *Is the pain severe?*

B: Yes, I cannot swallow anything.

Dialogue B

A: What's the matter?

B: **My throat hurts** *whenever I swallow.*

A: Is there anything else wrong?

B: No, not really.



Notes:

❖ Dialogue A

A: Can I help you?

B: **I have a pain in my throat.**

A: Let's *take your temperature* first.

Dialogue B

A: Hello, how may I help you?

B: **I have a pain in my throat.** But it only hurts

when I get up in the morning.

A: Do you have a humidifier in your room?
Sometimes dry air can make your throat hurt.

B: No. Maybe *that's the reason*.



Notes:

❖ Dialogue A

A: Brian, you are *hardly* eating.
What's the matter?

B: **My throat aches.**

It hurts when I swallow something.

A: You might want to *see a doctor*.

B: Yes, I plan to see a doctor tomorrow.

Dialogue B

A: Matthew, why do you clear your throat so often?

B: **My throat aches.**

A: Oh, drink hot water *as often as you can* and keep your room humid.

B: Thanks for your advice.



Notes:

❖ Dialogue A

A: **My throat is swollen.**

B: Since when?

A: I *caught a cold* last week.

B: *How about seeing* a doctor before it gets worse?

Dialogue B

A: Justin, what's up?

You look very uncomfortable.

B: Yeah, **my throat is swollen.**

It's really painful when I speak.

A: That's too bad. I hope you *feel better* soon.

B: I hope so too.
